As a follow up to the November 13 Economic Development Luncheon, the Chamber continues to work with Grow PA. Recently TCACC was asked to be included on a letter inviting members of the General Assembly to a breakfast briefing. The briefing will occur in early February and focus on the Grow PA initiative and its legislative priorities for the 2019-2020 season.

ABOUT GROW PA: Grow PA is a statewide initiative to convene people and organizations throughout Pennsylvania to establish a modern economic growth agenda.

GROW PA BACKGROUND:

Over the past two years, the Chamber of Commerce for Greater Philadelphia has been meeting with numerous chambers of commerce and other business and civic organizations from around the state to discuss how we can work together to build an economic growth agenda for the Commonwealth.

From those discussions, we created Grow PA.

Grow PA is an open-source initiative designed to engage Pennsylvanians from the business and civic communities. In a state with an unemployment rate that lags behind the national average, an aging population, and an anemic economy, the time to collectively plan a path forward is now.

Grow PA began in the fall of 2017 as a virtual discussion with people from various sectors of our business and civic community. We created an online forum and weekly newsletter to share stories of growth and innovation from around the state. The newsletter has thousands of subscribers and contributors and is growing daily.

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce sent a call-out to Chambers and organizations to add their names to this letter – TCACC signed on!

U.S. Chamber of Commerce Government Shutdown Sign-On Letter

January 17, 2019

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND MEMBERS OF CONGRESS:

On behalf of the American business community, we urge Congress and the administration to immediately take steps to restore the full operation of the federal government.

The current shutdown - now the longest in American history - is causing significant and in sorne cases lasting darnage to families, businesses, and the economy as a whole. The harm is well documented and continues to compound with each passing day.

Since the shutdown began, various compromises have been floated by both Republicans and Democrats. There are numerous paths forward that would allow for the government to be reopened that should be acceptable to all parties. Failing to seize on one of those compromises that can pass Congress and be signed into law is unacceptable.

The time to act, the time to end this shutdown is now so that we can keep the economy moving forward.

A NEW WAY TO COMMUTE

In southeastern Pennsylvania, 76% of commuters drive alone to work, and only 9% carpool (U.S. Census Bureau, 2016). Carpooling

is an alternative transportation mode that helps to reduce the number of single occupancy cars on the road. Something the U.S 422 Corridor could benefit from! If more people choose carpooling over driving alone, we could alleviate congestion, improve the environment and quality of life for our region.

Carpooling is one of the easiest alternative transportation modes to participate in. It consists of two to four people sharing a ride to a similar location, on a similar schedule. A typical example are co-workers riding to and from work. Carpooling saves you money by reducing your travel costs such as, fuel and tolls, decreases personal vehicle wear and tear, time stuck in traffic and stress.

Their enthusiasm and energy levels were amazing. They all deserve our thanks... and help."


