Pennsylvania politicians from both sides of the aisle agree that the Commonwealth's current tax code lacks efficiency in today's economic climate. Due to the high tax rate and complex tax codes, businesses small and large throughout Pennsylvania suffer a competitive disadvantage.

The corporate net income tax rate is the second highest in the country. This high tax rate can be a burden to Commonwealth businesses and set them at a disadvantage compared to other states. Getting the corporate tax rate down to around the national average could create a level playing field with other states, and even give Pennsylvania businesses a competitive edge.

The complexity of Pennsylvania's sales tax creates a loophole that could potentially hurt businesses.

Currently, many goods and services go through multiple layers of taxation as they pass through production processes. Instead of a sales tax being implemented to the final product, the process of production undergoes taxation multiple times before it's finished. A more simplistic code would make sales taxes more adequate.

The current tax code basically holds down businesses with the burden of high tax rates and overcomplexity. The most sensible way to unleash the full potential of Commonwealth business is to make the tax code more simplistic.

What are TDM Strategies?

Traffic congestion is something that we all experience, the Greater Philadelphia region has over four million people living and working throughout it which can lead to congestion and poor air quality if everyone drove alone. Comprising of 24 municipalities, the U.S. 422 Corridor in Montgomery, Chester, and Berks Counties has experienced three decades of strong growth in population and economic activity, which has resulted in major traffic congestion.

What can we do to improve congestion along the U.S. 422 corridor? A logical solution might seem to be adding capacity to meet demand. Adding capacity in the form of highway expansion is extremely expensive and often does not solve the congestion problem. Transportation Demand Management (TDM) is a way to maximize the use of our existing transportation system by using the latest technologies and innovative strategies. Some of the most effective TDM strategies include:

- Organizations allowing flextime, compressed work weeks and staggered shifts
- Improving cycling amenities and infrastructure
- Providing carsharing
- Investing in park and ride facilities
- Improving pedestrian safety and accessibility
- Providing shuttle services
- Promoting carpooling and vanpooling
- Improving Public transit
- Offering telework programs
